

#### Step 3. Charge the handset

• Place the handset on the base and charge for at least 24 hours. When the handset is fully charged, the 📑 icon is displayed.



## IMPORTANT

You cannot access the battery in the handset. Do not attempt to remove the battery, as you may damage the phone. If you need to replace the battery, contact customer service.

#### When the handset is fully charged, plug the telephone line cord into the socket marked 2 on the underside of the base and plug the other end into the telephone wall socket.

#### Step 4. Setting the date and time:


If you have subscribed to a Caller ID Service and Auto Clock is set to on the date and time is set automatically for all handsets when you receive vour first call.

If you do not have a Caller ID service, you can set the date and time manually.

- Press and scroll ▼ to Clock/Alarm. Press ok . Display shows Date & Time, then press ok
- Enter the date using the format MM/DD e.g. 08/04 for August 4th.
- · Enter the time using the 12 hour format HH:MM, e.g. 02:45.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to change from A (am) to P (pm) and press ok

Press o to return to standby.

Display Call Log / Scroll Up / Volume up Open the Call log. Press to enter Call Log menu and then press ▼ to select Call List or Answ machine menu. Scroll up through lists and settinas. Menu / OK Enter the main menu. Select the option displayed on screen. Confirm menu option – OK is displayed on screen. Redial Open the redial list. Talk / Hands-free key Make or answer a call. Activate and deactivate hands-free during a call. IMPORTANT Hands-free activation can suddenly increase the volume in the earpiece to a very high level. Make sure the handset is not too close

to your ear. Pulse to Tone Dialling / \* / Keypad lock During a call, press and hold to switch from pulse dialling to tone dialling. Dial a \*. In standby mode press and hold to lock/unlock the keypad.

Only use the telephone line cord supplied. This equipment is not designed for making emergency telephone calls when the power fails. Alternative arrangements should be made for access to emergency services.

If you hear a warning beep every 2 minutes during a call, you will need to recharge the handset before you can use it again

In ideal conditions, a fully charged battery should give up to 7 hours talk time or up to 130 hours standby time on a single charge.

Note that the new battery does not reach the full capacity until it has been put to normal use for several davs.

To keep the battery in the best condition. leave the handset off the base for a few hours at a time.

### INTELLIGENT CHARGING

Your IT6 supports Intelligent Charging, this means when the handset is fully charged, the base will automatically detect this and stop drawing power from the electrical outlet to charge the handset, saving unnecessary power usage.

# **Display** icons

- ON when the line is in use. Flashes when there is an incoming call.
- Flashes when you have missed calls and a new number(s) are in the 81 Calls list.
- X Handset ringer is OFF.
- Steady when the handset is registered and within range of the base. Disappears лĿ when the handset is out of range and flashes when searching for the base.
- Flashes when you have new voicemail messages. Off when you have no voicemail messages.
- Phonebook is open.
- Ø The alarm clock has been set.
- Hands-free mode is activated.
- Answering machine is ON.

The approximate power levels of your battery are indicated as below

- Battery is fully charged.
- Battery is partially charged.
- Battery is running low.
- Battery is almost empty. The battery icon will flash and emit a warning beep every 2 minutes during call.


# Getting started

# Step 1. Set up the base

• Plug the power adapter into the socket marked 🖳 on the underside of the base and plug the other end into the electrical outlet.

## NOTE

Position the base at least 6 feet away from other electrical appliances to avoid interference. Putting it as high as possible ensures the best signal.




# IMPORTANT

Only use the power and telephone cables supplied with the product.

#### Step 2. Connect the charger (Multi-pack only)

• Plug the power adapter into the socket marked 🖳 on the underside of the charger and plug the other end into the electrical outlet.



# Menu navigation

# Navigating the menus

The basic steps of navigating through the menu and on-screen options.

- From the standby screen, press <sup>MENU</sup>
- The main menu is opened
- Use the  $\frac{VOL+}{CID}$  ( $\blacktriangle$ ) or  $\prod_{VOL-}$  ( $\bigtriangledown$ ) keys to scroll through the menu.
- Soft key options OK and not splayed. Press <sup>MENU</sup> to select OK and open a sub-menu or validate an option. Press **BACK** to go back to previous menu level, correct a character or cancel an action.
- Press **o** to return to standby.

# NOTE

If you do not press any button on the handset for 30 seconds the display will automatically return to standby. It will also return to standby when the handset is placed on the base or charger.


# Answering machine

Your IT6 answering machine records unanswered calls when it is activated. It can store up to 59 messages within the maximum recording time up to 30 minutes. Each message can be up to 3 minutes long. Your personal outgoing messages can be up to 3 minutes long.

You can operate your answering machine from:

- the base.
- the handset.
- · remotely, from another phone.

#### Overview of answering machine



### Base control keys

- 0 Press to turn the answer machine ON / OFF
- Play new messages Press to stop playback
- Skip to the next message during message playback ►
- Replay current message M Press twice to skip back to previous message
- X Delete current message during message playback Long press to delete all messages when TAM is in standby mode
- **a**(1)) Increase speaker volume during message playback
- **d**) Decrease speaker volume during message playback

#### Save a number from the Calls list to the phonebook

- Press  $\blacktriangle$  and then press  $\frac{MENU}{OK}$ . The most recent call is displayed.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the number vou want.
- Press <sup>MENU</sup> then press ▼ until Save Number is displayed.
- Press **MENU**. Enter Name is displayed. Use the keypad to enter the name
- Press or then the number is displayed, the user can then edit the number if required and must press **OK** to save the number (even if has not been edited).
- Press **o** to return to standby.

#### Copy a redial number to the phonebook

- Press <sup>REDIAL</sup> and scroll ▲ or ▼ to the entry you want and press MENU OK
- Display shows Save Number. Press
- Enter the name and press **MENU**.
- Edit the number if required and Dress or

# Display language

- You can change the display language • Press ok scroll ▼ to Personal Set
- and press ok Scroll ▼ to Language. Press <sup>MENU</sup>/<sub>OK</sub>.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to select the
- language you want.
- Press <sup>MENU</sup> to confirm.
- Press To return to standby.

#### Keypad lock

Prevent accidental dialing while carrying the handset by locking the keypad. While the keypad is locked, you can answer incoming calls as normal. • Press and hold \*.

- The display shows Keys Locked .
- To unlock the handset, press and hold \* again.
- Paging key Paging is a useful way of finding lost handsets. • Press ④ on the base.
- All handsets ring. • Press 🖲 again to cancel the
- paging call or press any key on the handset to stop the paging call.

#### Answering machine key illumination

Answering machine ON /OFF illuminates at all times.

Play - illuminates when the answering machine is ON / flashes when there are new messages.

- Press 🗳 to dial the phone number entered.

#### Call from the phonebook

- Press ▼. The first entry in the phonebook is displayed.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the entry you want.
- Press 🕊 to dial the number.

#### Call from the Calls list

- Press ▲ to enter the Call log option menu, then press **OK** to enter Call List. The most recent call is displayed.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the entry you want.

• The phonebook is full. Delete an entry to free memory.

• Try disconnecting and connecting the base power supply.

• Maximum number of 4 handsets has been reached.

### Redial the last number

- Press REDIAL. The last number dialled is displayed.
- If the number has more than 12

#### digits, the display shows ▶ and the cursor blinks. Press **MUTE** to display the rest. If the number is stored in the Phonebook, the name is displayed.

• Press 🕊 to dial.

#### Call a number in the redial list

Press REDIAL. The last number dialled is displayed.

If required, scroll  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\checkmark$  to display the number you want.

Press to dial the number.

#### Call direct memory numbers 1 though 9

• Press and hold a key from 1 to 9 until the number is displayed and dialed.

#### Answer a call

- When the phone rings and flashes in the display, if the handset is off the base press handset is on the base simply lift the handset to answer the call.
- Press 🗳 again to answer the call via hands-free · To switch between hands-free

and the earpiece press 🗳.

#### Adjust volume

• During a call, press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\checkmark$  to adjust the earpiece or hands-free volume. The level is shown in the handset display.

#### Mute

Mute the microphone so that you can talk to someone else in the room without your caller hearing you.

- During a call, press **BACK**. The microphone is muted.
- Press **MUTE** again to turn the microphone back on.

#### End a call • Press 🛜

After you hang up, the duration the phone is off-hook is displayed for 5 seconds.

#### Phonebook

The IT6 handset phonebook can store up to 100 names and numbers.

Numbers can be up to 24 digits long and names up to 12 characters long. Entries are stored in alphabetical order.

#### Store an entry in the phonebook

Press ok
Phonebook is displayed.

- Press **OK** . New Entry is displayed.
- Press ok . Enter Name is displayed.
- Enter a name and press <sup>MENU</sup>
- Enter a number. Press **MENU** to save.
- Press on to return to standby.

#### Store a direct memory number

- Press ok twice.
- Scroll ▼ to Direct Mem and press MENU
- Key 1 is displayed. Press MENU If no number is stored No Entry is displayed. If a number is stored the name will be displayed.
- Scroll ▼ to Key X, where X is the keypad number where the entry will be stored. Press **MENU**.
- ADD is displayed. Press <sup>MENU</sup>
- The first phonebook entry is displayed. Enter the first letter of the name to search

alphabetically then scroll  $\blacktriangle$  or ullet to the exact entry, then press MENU OK

Press To return to standby.
